PUCK SHOOTING MACHINES

POLICY AND PROCEDURES

Approved: 14 July 2008

1.0 INTRODUCTION

The Association owns two puck shooting machines which are available for use in the Multiplex arenas. This statement is intended to describe the policies and procedures regarding their use.

2.0 STORAGE

- The two machines are stored in a locker adjacent to the main entrance to the Shorty Brown area. All supplementary supplies (pucks, power cord, puck loading cylinder) are stored with the machines
- Team personnel are responsible for putting the machines and supplementary supplies on the ice at the beginning of each session.
- The machines and supplementary supplies must be promptly removed from the rink at the end of each session so that City personnel may begin to flood the ice.

3.0 USE OF THE MACHINES

The machines are available for:

- Goaltender development clinics
- Development Team practices
- Special development camps
- Arctic Winter Games team practices
- Canada Winter Games team practices

Special requests for other situations must be made through the appropriate divisional Governor.

4.0 SCHEDULING

Persons wishing to use the machines, for other than the goaltender clinics, should confirm their availability with the Equipment Manager.

5.0 OPERATIONS

Users must note the following:

- A short orientation is required before using the machines. Please contact the Equipment Manager for an orientation.
- The operating manual is located under the removable housing on each machine. Please read the manual before using the machine.
- The power source for the machines is at the players benches.

- Both machines may be plugged into the same outlet if needed.
- The speed dial must be set at 'zero' before starting or stopping the machine
- The power cord, puck loading cylinder and the supply of pucks must be kept with the machine.
- Use only new pucks.
- Please report any problems to the Equipment Manager.
